& Country Club, Director of Parks and Recreation for the Cities of Kanata, Newmarket and Hamilton, a Sports and Recreation Consultant with the Ontario Ministry of Tourism and Recreation in Ottawa and the Recreation Director for the Royal Ottawa Rehab and Psychiatric Hospital.

Rick has also served as an Associate Professor in Recreation, Sport, Hospitality and Tourism Management at the University of Ottawa, Algonquin and George Brown Colleges. In his leisure and volunteer time, Rick presently serves as a Director on the Canadian Paralympic Committee Board of Directors, as Past-President of the Canadian Society of Club Managers Ottawa-Valley Branch and Past-President of the Canadian Society of Association Executives Ottawa-Gatineau Chapter.
