Jacqueline Gori: Life Changing Experiences with her Service Dog

Jacqueline is an Artist, Photographer and Charity Founder. Her life living on 3 continents, being wheelchair-bound for 5 years and working with animals and pets has taught her many things. She pours all this experience into her art.

Mainly self-taught, she's been mentored by one of Canada's top artists, Gordon Harrison, and had the opportunity of exhibiting her work in the prestigious Gordon Harrison Gallery in Ottawa for an apprentice show.



She's won many awards including the Canada 150 Award and has exhibited at 3 top-tier galleries in the UK and in Canada.

Jacqueline believes art can change people's lives. That's why she invests much of her time and her talent to blessing those that need help – from house-bound kids to those living with autism and PTSD. She has spearheaded a fund-raising book, "I Love LABS - The Cooperslane Legacy", 50 adorable stories beautifully written and portraved by award-winning author Nancy Silcox and award-winning artist Jacqueline Gori and her art students who all donated their time and talent to create a book that will give someone with a disability their freedom back by funding a service dog for them.

Jacqueline enjoys helping people so much that she decided to make this a permanent move. So in November 2019 she founded Partners with Paws – a service dog charity mainly helping people who suffer from psychiatric and other mental health challenges.

At our February Meeting



Our speaker in February was Tim Burrows, a retired Vice President of Forty Creek Distillery and a graduate of the University of Toronto where he earned an honours degree in psychology. Tim has owned and driven battery-electric cars for the past 7 years and has logged over 250,000 kilometres without the need for gasoline or diesel fuel. His talk was entitled "Should Your Next Car be Electric?" and in it, he makes the case that we are nearing the "tipping point" when electric cars will replace those powered by gasoline.

72 members attended this meeting. Tim talked for 40 minutes followed by a question period which lasted 45 minutes – the longest we've ever had. Even after the formal meeting ended, further informal discussions about the topic lasted 10 minutes – a measure of the interest in this topic.
