Alberto Suarez-Esteban: No Dig Gardening: Benefits for the planet and your back.

Alberto is originally from Spain, where he developed a deep fascination and passion for Nature. This passion led him to pursue a B.Sc. in Biology, a M.Sc. in Conservation Biology, and a Ph.D. in Ecology. After about a decade in Academia, he decided to pursue more tangible results and to spend more time outside, where he thrives. During the winter, Alberto teaches "Ecosystem and Environmental Change" at Carleton University. The rest of the year, he operates Nature's Apprentice Farm, a small organic farm in Pakenham, born from his desire to support a food system that regenerates the health of both people and the land.



Digging a garden threatens to disturb not only our back, but also the soil ecosystem, which is what truly feeds our plants. But, what is the alternative? Is it really possible to grow food without digging? Please join farmer and teacher Alberto Suarez-Esteban to get these and other questions answered such as maintaining healthy soil for our plants, making compost and using it to start transplants in pots. We will learn these and many other tips to apply in our gardens for growing healthier plants to obtain healthy food with less effort.






## **Our Puzzling Brain**
