Fighting fraud: If it sounds "too good to be true"... it probably is

Did you know, only about 5% of Frauds and Scams are reported?

Police, Including the O.P.P., have seen an increase in reported FRAUDS (Scams) with hundreds of thousands of dollars being lost to various scams occurring in our communities. Safeguarding yourself and your loved ones is key to combatting this rising trend, which too often targets the vulnerable and trusting members of our communities.

Everyone, regardless of age, can take many basic steps to better protect themselves from becoming victims of fraud.

This presentation, by a member of the O.P.P., will explain some of the more common Scams and Frauds that are becoming increasingly familiar. It will



offer advice and suggestions on being aware, prepared and able to spot these attempts to steal money from us. As we go through the presentation together questions and comments are very welcome and hopefully, we can all learn from each other.

Above all, this O.P.P. presentation will show that we are ALL vulnerable to these everchanging Scams and if you have already sent funds, don't be embarrassed - you're not alone. Let's Fight Fraud together!



Artificial intelligence (AI) was the topic of Gord Larose's presentation at our September meeting. He traced the history of AI from Greece, through the Middle Ages to early computers and finally to the present day where AI is everywhere. He described the ChatGPT website and his favourite Derplexity. Gord then went on to explain the tie into applications such as Alexa and driverless cars.
